Battle's Over - A Nation's Tribute - 11 November 2018

On 11 November 2018, the United Kingdom and its friends overseas will mark the day 100 years ago when the guns fell silent at the end of the First World War. A nationwide Day of Commemorative Events marking the Centenary of the end of the First World War and paying tribute to the millions killed or wounded in battle, and those on the home front who struggled amidst pain and loss to help ensure freedom survived. We will remember and unite in spirit with people across the world. The time table is unified - At **18.55: The Last Post** 1000 individual Buglers sound this historic tribute at WW1 Beacons of Light locations across the Nation and UK Overseas Territories. **19.00: WW1 Beacons of Light** Over 1000 Beacons of Light symbolising an end to the darkness of war and a return to the light of peace. **19.05: Ringing Out for Peace** 1000 cathedrals and churches, including **Holy Ghost**, will ring out their bells across the nation, and beyond, in celebration of Peace. **19.05: A Cry for Peace around the World:** 100 Town Criers throughout the United Kingdom and other countries around the World join together in an International Cry for Peace around the World **We will gather at 19.00 in Holy Ghost Church, ring the bell at 19.05, and then pray night prayer together. Our First World War stained glass window will be illuminated, – please do come and mark this special time as a parish.**
