Mass Guidelines (please note that mass is currently being celebrated in the hall)

Although most of the Covid-19 regulations relating to places of worship have now been removed, the continuing threat from the coronavirus requires the continuation of some precautions, as detailed below.

There is no longer any formal limit on Mass attendance, but admissions for Mass may need to be restricted in order to ensure everyone's safety. **Please arrive** at least 10 minutes early to allow for registration and help our stewards manage admissions.

Anyone who is showing any of the **symptoms** of Covid-19, as well as every other member of their household, and anyone required to self-isolate, should not come to the church.

Some seats in the side aisle are reserved for those unable to approach the station for Holy Communion

There are now designated seats (numbered 1-35) are for those who wish to sit alone or for couples from the same household.



There are no restrictions for other places except usual capacity

Please do not remove the chairs from where they have been stacked

The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation remains suspended. If you wish, you can attend Mass on a weekday instead, when there are normally fewer people present. The Bishops of England and Wales are hoping that all Catholics will be able to return to full participation in the Eucharist by the First Sunday of Advent (28th November 2021).

Although Face coverings are optional while you are in the church, their continued use is recommended and we request that you continue to wear one. Those who choose not to wear a mask are encouraged to maintain a social distance from people they would not normally mix with.

Hand-sanitising will continue as you enter the church.

Mass cards are not currently available and **Holy water** is not available at present.

Copies of the newsletter are available on line.

There is no offertory collection for the time being, but there is a basket at the back of the church in the narthex in which you can place your donations for the parish. The preferred method of giving is by **direct payment** to the parish bank account. Please contact the parish office for details

As you enter the church, you will find the QR code poster on your right, in St. Anne's Cloister

Please refer to our website at least once a week, where changes will be posted. You will also find other spiritual and devotional material, which is updated every week. Masses will continue to be streamed online and there are quick links on our website for you to access from the Cathedral and other churches in the Diocese. Access to the church will be for the 30 minutes only before each mass to satisfy our 'track & trace' management protocols - hand sanitizing and personal registration and face coverings will be required.

There continues to be no access to church halls, kitchens or toilets.

We are confident that we are taking every precaution to keep you safe and entry to the church is managed very sensitively by our stewards, without whom, I wouldn't be able to open the church for you.

MASS INTENTIONS If you would like a Mass said for a particular intention; for someone who is ill or a loved one who has died; in thanksgiving for an answer to prayer or perhaps a private intention, contact Jane in the parish office who will help you find a date and time which suits you. It is traditional to make an offering at the same time. This is simply what you can afford and would like to give. Please note that to comply with GDPR rules we need the permission of the person named if it is to be made public unless they are deceased.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR MONTHLY OFFERINGS and for your continued generosity to the parish. Many of you know that we are currently not encouraged to count and bank cash donations so the most efficient way for you to give is by standing order. Most of you have now started using this method and we are incredibly grateful. It saves us time and eliminates the need to count cash and make journeys to the bank in these difficult times and it's a coronavirus free transaction!!
