The word Advent means "coming" and it is a time to prepare for the coming of Jesus Christ at Christmas, but it also invites us to prepare for Jesus to come at the end of time, so it is a reflective period for some serious thinking about our future – our ultimate future! During Advent the Church uses the sombre colour purple for vestments and hangings, and the readings from scripture and the music and prayers all have a tone of waiting in anticipation. At this dark time of the year the theme of light is significant as the church waits for Christ – the "Light of the World".

The third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday and I invite you to come and bring your baby Jesus crib piece to mass to be blessed.

#### The Tradition of Blessing the Bambinelli



The beautiful Advent Tradition, *Bambinelli Sunday*, was instituted by Saint Pope John Paul II during his Papacy. The tradition follows that on the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) children and adults bring their Baby Jesus figures from their homes to St Peters Square where they are blessed by the Pope.

All children and families are invited to bring the Baby Jesus figure from their homes to be blessed. Families can make their own **Bambinelli** if they wish.

Pope Francis has continued the tradition, blessing the statuettes which children bring before him in the Square. Parishes around the world now join in the celebration to help children and young people to prepare for Jesus.

A suggestion is, following the blessing prayer, you wrap your **Bambinelli** and place it with the gifts under your Christmas tree. Open it as a family on Christmas morning where the youngest member of the family can place it in the crib. A gift of the presence of Christ, then, will be in your home this Christmas.

#### Here is a prayer you may like to use to ask God's blessing

God, our Father you so loved mankind that you sent us your only Son Jesus, born of the Virgin Mary, to save us and lead us back to you.

We pray that, with your Blessing, these images of Jesus who is about to come among us, may be a sign of your presence and love in our homes.

Father, give your Blessing to us too, to our parents, to our families and to our friends.

Open our hearts so that we may be able to receive Jesus in joy, always do what he asks and see him in all those who are in need of our love.

We ask you this in the name of Jesus your beloved Son who comes to give the world peace.

He lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.



50 Parishioners and friends spent a very thought provoking and memorable day at Buckfast this week. I am pleased to share with you the comments from Penny and Richard Stranack and am grateful to them for sending them in.

#### Thank you all for sharing the day with me

'Before the Advent Day of Reflection at Buckfast, I had not thought of the Past, the Present and the Future in terms of Memory, Experience and Imagination so it made me think of these concepts in a new and interesting way. I came away inspired by the 'community' feeling that Hope will overcome Fear as we 'look to the future through the

'Father Philip drew on Holy Scripture, the Wisdom of the Fathers of the 'Early' as well as of the contemporary Church to reflect on our relationship with Past, Present and Future aspects of the Church's life.

Illustrated with an imaginative selection of 'power point' images, we were challenged to consider how the Coronavirus pandemic had been an epoch changing experience for the whole of society.





Such events as the Norman Conquest, the Black Death, the Reformation and the opening up of the 'New World' and the European Wars of recent centuries, including the current turbulence centred on the Ukraine have has a cataclysmic effect on the Church, as a result of which there can be no going back to the old 'normal'.

As the Revelation of Saint John, echoing the words of Isaiah and Jeremiah, quotes the words of the Lord, "I am making all things new".

The climax of the Day was, of course, the Mass in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel of the Abbey Church in which our identity in the Body of Christ,

### Use of the Parish Halls

25th November 2022

Now that we regularly use our hall facilities again after the restrictions of lockdown, we ask that you adhere to the guidelines below to keep everyone safe.

<u>Under our current arrangements</u>, a LEAD PERSON is held ACCOUNTABLE AND RESPONSIBLE for;

- 1. booking the hall well in advance and making arrangements for
- 2. obtaining a key from the Parish Office on a Tuesday, Wednesday or Friday
- 3. making sure that the hall kitchen & toilets is adequately cleaned after use and that the tables and chairs are returned after use as shown in the photographs below.
- 4. Posting the key, immediately after locking the hall, through the Presbytery letterbox

We are continuing to work towards being a coin-free parish. Where refreshments are paid for, a pre-paid loyalty card (costing £10.00.) is now available.

Pre packed biscuits, milk cartons and sugar sachets are provided to maintain the highest hygiene standards and must be used. Please do not bring your own!

Please use the hand-sanitiser available on entry the building

Anyone who is showing any of the **symptoms of Covid-19**, as well as every other member of their household, and anyone required to self-isolate, should not come to the premises

**Although Face coverings** are optional while you are in the hall, their continued use is recommended. Those who choose not to wear a mask are encouraged to maintain a social distance from people they would not normally mix with.
