

in Holy Ghost on Wednesday 1st May after the morning mass. Do please come along and join them.



LAUDATO SI WEEK 19-26 MAY 24: CALLING ALL CRAFT GROUPS AND CREATORS TO CONTRIBUTE TO THIS WONDERFUL CELEBRATION

During Laudato Si' week, there will be an exhibition and prayer walk at Plymouth Cathedral interpreting Laudato Si' through artwork and reflections by pupils from local schools. All visitors to the Cathedral will also be invited to add to a mass participation artwork called the Mossy Carpet. People are invited to make a textile tuft such as crochet, knit, embroider, plait, pompom, tuft... or something else to attach to the carpet! This artwork will help us to consider how our small actions can make a huge change, and how our Christian faith calls us to be part of the restoration of nature.

There will be drop-in workshops from 12-4pm on Monday 20 May at the Cathedral of St Mary and St Boniface but the Mossy Carpet will be in place from 18^{th-} 24th May for people to visit and add their contributions. 

Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse – 30th April 2024

The Bishop's of England and Wales have set aside the Tuesday of the Fifth Week of Easter as a Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse. This is a day of prayer for those who have been abused, during a season of hope and new life. This year's focus is on communities who have been directly affected by allegations or convictions related to abuse – especially, but not exclusively, within the Church.

General prayer for a culture of openness and loving support for survivors of abuse

We pray for those who have come forward to speak of the abuse they have suffered, and for those who are not yet able to.

May the Spirit help us to offer a response that is rooted in the love of Christ and to be a community in which they can continue to feel believed and safe as the search for truth and justice unfolds. God of justice and healing; Hear our prayer.
