# Message of the Holy Father Francis for Lent 2025, 25.02.2025

## ***Let us journey together in hope***

Dear brothers and sisters,

We begin our annual pilgrimage of Lent in faith and hope with the penitential rite of the imposition of ashes. The Church, our mother and teacher, invites us to open our hearts to God's grace, so that we can celebrate with great joy the paschal victory of Christ the Lord over sin and death, which led Saint Paul to exclaim: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" (1 Cor 15:54-55). Indeed, Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, is the heart of our faith and the pledge of our hope in the Father's great promise, already fulfilled in his beloved Son: life eternal (cf. Jn 10:28; 17:3).<sup>[1]</sup>

This Lent, as we share in the grace of the Jubilee Year, I would like to propose a few reflections on what it means *to journey together in hope*, and on the summons to conversion that God in his mercy addresses to all of us, as individuals and as a community.

First of all, *to journey*. The Jubilee motto, "Pilgrims of Hope", evokes the lengthy journey of the people of Israel to the Promised Land, as recounted in the Book of Exodus. This arduous path from slavery to freedom was willed and guided by the Lord, who loves his people and remains ever faithful to them. It is hard to think of the biblical exodus without also thinking of those of our brothers and sisters who in our own day are fleeing situations of misery and violence in search of a better life for themselves and their loved ones. A first call to conversion thus comes from the realization that all of us are pilgrims in this life; each of us is invited to stop and ask how our lives reflect this fact. Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and hopelessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone? Am I seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade my dignity? It would be a good Lenten exercise for us to compare our daily life with that of some migrant or foreigner, to learn how to sympathize with their experiences and in this way discover what God is asking of us so that we can better advance on our journey to the house of the Father. This would be a good "examination of conscience" for all of us wayfarers.

Second, *to journey together*. The Church is called to walk together, to be synodal<sup>[2]</sup> Christians are called to walk at the side of others, and never as lone travellers. The Holy Spirit impels us not to remain self-absorbed, but to leave ourselves behind and keep walking towards God and our brothers and sisters.<sup>[3]</sup> Journeying together means consolidating the unity grounded in our common dignity as children of God (cf. Gal 3:26-28). It means walking side-by-side, without shoving or stepping on others, without envy or hypocrisy, without letting anyone be left behind or excluded. Let us all walk in the same direction, tending towards the same goal, attentive to one another in love and patience.

This Lent, God is asking us to examine whether in our lives, in our families, in the places where we work and spend our time, we are capable of walking together with others, listening to them, resisting the temptation to become self-absorbed and to think only of our own needs. Let us ask ourselves in the presence of the Lord whether, as bishops, priests, consecrated persons and laity in the service of the Kingdom of God, we cooperate with others. Whether we show ourselves welcoming, with concrete gestures, to those both near and far. Whether we make others feel a part of the community or keep them at a distance.<sup>[4]</sup> This, then, is a second call to conversion: a summons to synodality.

Third, let us journey together *in hope*, for we have been given a promise. May *the hope that does not disappoint* (cf. *Rom5:5*), the central message of the Jubilee,<sup>[5]</sup> be the focus of our Lenten journey towards the victory of Easter. As Pope Benedict XVI taught us in the Encyclical *Spe Salvi*, “the human being needs unconditional love. He needs the certainty which makes him say: ‘neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord’ (*Rom8:38-39*)”.<sup>[6]</sup> Christ, my hope, has risen!<sup>[7]</sup> He lives and reigns in glory. Death has been transformed into triumph, and the faith and great hope of Christians rests in this: the resurrection of Christ!

This, then, is the third call to conversion: a call to hope, to trust in God and his great promise of eternal life. Let us ask ourselves: Am I convinced that the Lord forgives my sins? Or do I act as if I can save myself? Do I long for salvation and call upon God’s help to attain it? Do I concretely experience the hope that enables me to interpret the events of history and inspires in me a commitment to justice and fraternity, to care for our common home and in such a way that no one feels excluded?

Sisters and brothers, thanks to God’s love in Jesus Christ, we are sustained in the hope that does not disappoint (cf. *Rom5:5*). Hope is the “sure and steadfast anchor of the soul”.<sup>[8]</sup> It moves the Church to pray for “everyone to be saved” (1 *Tim2:4*) and to look forward to her being united with Christ, her bridegroom, in the glory of heaven. This was the prayer of Saint Teresa of Avila: “Hope, O my soul, hope. You know neither the day nor the hour. Watch carefully, for everything passes quickly, even though your impatience makes doubtful what is certain, and turns a very short time into a long one” (*The Exclamations of the Soul to God*, 15:3).<sup>[9]</sup>

May the Virgin Mary, Mother of Hope, intercede for us and accompany us on our Lenten journey.

## ARE YOU GOING INTO HOSPITAL?



The Hospital Chaplaincy telephone number: 01392 402024. A message can always be left there. The Blessed Sacrament Presbytery number can also be used: 01392 274724.

It is now more difficult for members of the clergy to request information regarding your stay in hospital, including which Ward you are in. This is now regarded as confidential information and will not readily be supplied to any caller without the specific permission of the patient. Also, staff on wards will no longer be allowed to say who is on their Ward if people make a general enquiry. If you are admitted to hospital and would like a member of The Chaplaincy Team to visit you –

**DO .....** Please inform the Chaplaincy Department which ward you expect to be on and when you will be there, if you know in advance that you are going into hospital. Specifically inform a member of the ward staff that you would like to be visited by a chaplain ensuring that you state which denomination you belong to. Otherwise, it could be that you may not see a chaplain as you may be asleep, having treatment or they may not even know you are in hospital.

Inform your relatives about your wishes concerning visits from a chaplain if you are taken into hospital unexpectedly. Your relatives can then notify the Chaplaincy Department should such an event take place.

**DON'T....** Just presume that the chaplains will hear about your stay in hospital – they probably won't. DON'T expect ward staff automatically to let the chaplains know you are in hospital.

**ACT.....** If you wish to be visited by a member of The Chaplaincy Team during your stay in hospital, the Hospital Chaplaincy telephone number: 01392 402024. A message can always be left there. The Blessed Sacrament Presbytery number can also be used: 01392 274724.

**The Blessing of Easter Breakfasts** is a tradition we have marked for many years at Holy Ghost. **Święconka** meaning "the blessing of the Easter baskets", is one of the most enduring and beloved Polish traditions on Holy Saturday during Easter.

The tradition of food blessing at Easter, which has early-medieval roots in Christian society is said to date from the 7th century in its basic form, the more modern form containing bread and eggs (symbols of resurrection and Christ) are said to date from the 12th century.

Baskets containing a selection of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white linen or lace napkin and decorated with sprigs of boxwood the typical Easter evergreen. Families take special pride in preparing a decorative and tasteful basket with crisp linens, occasionally embroidered for the occasion, and boxwood and ribbon woven through the handle. ## Exmouth Food Bank Spring 2025 News

### Demand during the past quarter

The festive season combined with the start of a new year is always a busy time for Exmouth Food Bank as families struggle to deal with the extra expense. We would like to say a HUGE thank you to our loyal supporters including churches, schools, clubs, businesses and generous individuals who rallied to our call for help. Due to your generosity our team of volunteers (pictured left) were able to distribute 529 parcels that fed over 1135 people between 1 December 2024 and 31 January 2025.

Our mission during 2025 is not only to ensure that we continue to provide food to those in crisis, but also to work proactively with agencies such as Citizens Advice East Devon and East Devon District Council. Partnership working means we can assist individuals to move out of the financial situation that has led to them seeking our help. As part of this process we were delighted to welcome South West Water to the Food Bank for a second visit in February. They were able to advise our clients about the range of water tariffs that are available together with ways that they can help people clear any water debt.

### Celebrating our outreach work

As a food bank we are keen to support those who may not access our services directly but who could still do with a little help. We are proud of our outreach work which includes:

- Our ongoing project with Littleham Primary school where 69% of the children are on free school meals and some arrive at school without having had breakfast. We provide milk and fresh fruit on a weekly basis, giving the children a healthier start to the day which aids their concentration and ability to focus
- Enabling Brixington Church to add fresh fruit, vegetables and eggs to the food parcels they distribute as well as providing the Parent Hub at Open Door with fresh fruit to offer a healthy snack to the children who attend their sessions
- A new project with Seachange in Budleigh teaching people to cook healthily on a budget
- Our education programme which provides young people with a 'hands on' experience at the Food Bank so that they understand more about food poverty and the help that is available locally
- Providing stock to a pop-up pantry at Wesley's Cafe Budleigh where, those who are referred, can access staple foods at a reduced cost.

We were delighted to be invited to speak at East Devon's Voluntary Sector 'Thank You' Event in February and hope that the points we raised will inform the Anti-Poverty Strategy that the council are developing. The event enabled us to make valuable connections to other food banks working in Devon and to share best practice – many exchange visits are now planned!

An invitation to survivors We have two survivor groups in the diocese that have now been running for over a year, which provide an opportunity for anyone with lived experience of abuse to share their thoughts and ideas about survivor support work in our diocese. We are grateful to all those who so generously give of their time to attend these meetings.
