Share Your Faith – Give Life

World Mission Sunday falls on the penultimate Sunday in October. **In 2025, World Mission Sunday will be celebrated on Sunday 19 October.** It is the one Sunday in the year when the Mass is celebrated exclusively for missionary activity. The theme for World Mission Sunday 2025, chosen by Pope Francis, is "Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples", according to The Pontifical Mission Societies. This theme is connected to the Jubilee of Hope and encourages Christians to be messengers and builders of hope, especially in areas where the Church is young and facing challenges. The message emphasizes that hope is at the heart of the Christian mission and that every baptized person is called to share it.

Donations are collected at these worldwide Masses and they go, in their entirety, to support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the Church is new, young or poor.

Pray with the Global Church World Mission Sunday is our chance to show love and solidarity to our brothers and sisters overseas who share our faith. In offering our prayers, we join with missionaries everywhere in communion and compassion to support them in spreading the Good News, and by giving a donation we respond to Christ's call to feed the hungry and clothe the naked.

Missio is responsible for coordinating World Mission Sunday and provides new, young or poor dioceses with the essential support they need on their journey to becoming self-sufficient. 'We work through local bishops, churches and missionary congregations to ensure that resources are distributed equitably and justly – on the basis of need. The money goes directly from England and Wales to the bishops in the mission territories – local Church directly helping local Church!'

AID TO THE CHURCH IN NEED. We look forward to welcoming Steve Riedlinger to our masses on the weekend of 8th November. Steve is a Community Outreach Representative for Aid to the Church in Need (ACN), a Pontifical Foundation of the Catholic Church. In his role, Riedlinger visits parishes in the United Kingdom to share information about the charity's work and to thank parishioners for their support.

ARE YOU GOING INTO HOSPITAL? The Hospital Chaplaincy telephone number: 01392 402024. A message can always be left there. The Blessed Sacrament Presbytery number can also be used: 01392 274724. It is now more difficult for members of the clergy to request information regarding your stay in hospital, including which Ward you are in. This is now regarded as confidential information and will not readily be supplied to any caller without the specific permission of the patient. If you are admitted to hospital and would like a member of The Chaplaincy Team to visit you –

DO Please inform the Chaplaincy Department which ward you expect to be on and when you will be there, if you know in advance that you are going into hospital. Specifically inform a member of the ward staff that you would like to be visited by a chaplain ensuring that you state which denomination you belong to. Inform your relatives about your wishes concerning visits from a chaplain if you are taken into hospital unexpectedly. Your relatives can then notify the Chaplaincy Department



DON'T.... Just presume that the chaplains will hear about your stay in hospital – they probably won't. **DON'T** expect ward staff automatically to let the chaplains know you are in hospital.

ACT..... If you wish to be visited by a member of The Chaplaincy Team during your stay in hospital, the Hospital Chaplaincy telephone number: 01392 402024. A message can always be left there. The Blessed Sacrament Presbytery number can also be used: 01392 274724.

An invitation to survivors_We have two survivor groups in the diocese that have now been running for over a year, which provide an opportunity for anyone with lived experience of abuse to share their thoughts and ideas about survivor support work in our diocese. We are grateful to all those who so generously give of their time to attend these meetings. Following the most recent instructions from the Diocesan Safeguarding Team and in line with the CSSA 'Creating a Safer Environment', entry to the Sacristy from the Church must be recorded. In our situation, only liturgical ministers and servers have the right of access and regrettably, passage to the Presbytery via the Sacristy is no longer available to anyone else, when there are servers present.

The recent ceasefire in Gaza is a significant and welcome step. More than 67,000 people have been killed in Gaza, many of them children, and the ceasefire is essential in preventing more death and destruction. It is also the only way to ensure the delivery of urgently needed humanitarian aid. However, the ceasefire is just the first step. Aid has not yet been permitted to enter at the scale that is needed and the humanitarian situation is catastrophic. There now needs to be the urgent entry of aid into Gaza without restrictions. Leaders must do all they can to ensure that Palestinians can play a central role in rebuilding their lives and communities.

At this critical moment, your support is needed more than ever. Our trusted partners have continued to work in Gaza to give families practical help, despite the risks, but now we will be able to deliver practical help to many more of our neighbours in need.

Millions of people have fled their homes in search of safety. They urgently need shelter, food, healthcare and basic supplies.

A better world needs all of us. That's why we will continue to stand with families as they overcome the devastation of war. Our Church partners are already on the ground, providing emergency food, shelter and medical care, plus mental health support.

Within the last few days, our partner Caritas Jerusalem has delivered 10,000 cans of baby formula to families with newborns and young children who have been struggling to feed them during the conflict.

These brave teams stand ready to scale up their work and help more of our neighbours. We are working together with supporters like you to consistently provide life-saving aid to families living through this conflict.

The Church continues to stand with vulnerable families whose lives have been devastated by the war. Cardinal Pizzaballa, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, urges all of us to "reaffirm our unwavering commitment to stand beside the people of Gaza as they begin the long journey of healing, recovery and rebuilding". Cardinal Pizzaballa reminds us that the road ahead is long and we need to provide practical support to our sisters and brothers who are now on the road to recovery.
