### The Tradition of Blessing the Bambinelli



The beautiful Advent Tradition, *Bambinelli Sunday*, was instituted by Saint Pope John Paul II during his Papacy. The tradition follows that on the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) children and adults bring their Baby Jesus figures from their homes to St Peters Square where they are blessed by the Pope.

All children and families are invited to bring the Baby Jesus figure from their homes to be blessed. Families can make their own **Bambinelli** if they wish.

Pope Francis has continued the tradition, blessing the statuettes which children bring before him in the Square. Parishes around the world now join in the celebration to help children and young people to prepare for Jesus.

A suggestion is, following the blessing prayer, you wrap your *Bambinelli* and place it with the gifts under your Christmas tree. Open it as a family on Christmas morning where the youngest member of the family can place it in the crib. A gift of the presence of Christ, then, will be in your home this Christmas.

## Here is a prayer you may like to use to ask God's blessing


God, our Father you so loved mankind that you sent us your only Son Jesus, born of the Virgin Mary, to save us and lead us back to you.

#### Exmouth Food Bank Winter 2025 News

#### Current demand

During the summer months demand for the Food Bank fell for the first time in two years. We were delighted and saw this as a significant turning point for those who had been severely impacted by the cost of living crisis.

However, this respite has been short lived & use of our services has increased by 30% in September & October when compared to the same period last year. In the past two months we have provided food for over 1,120 people. This has put a strain on our financial reserves as demand is outstripping the donated food items we receive and we have had to purchase food to make up with the shortfall. Historically we also know that, as winter sets in, these numbers will continue to rise as those on low incomes struggle to buy provisions and pay their bills. Your support is vital to enable us to continue feeding those in need in our community – so THANK YOU, we really do appreciate all that you do.

#### Engaging with young people

As a team we are conscious of the need to spread information about food poverty and to break down the stigma associated with seeking help. We regularly hold active sessions with children who visit the Food Bank, roll up their sleeves and get stuck in with sorting and packing food parcels.

Recently we have been visited by a series of schools including Woodbury Primary School, Beacon Primary School, Withycombe Raleigh Primary School & the Deaf Academy. We have also had our annual visit from the local Beavers who brought the Exmouth & Exeter East MP David Reed along with them to provide an extra pair of hands!

#### Preparations for Christmas

This will help us meet the surge in demand over the festive period and ensure that we have a reserve going into 2026. ARE YOU GOING INTO HOSPITAL? The Hospital Chaplaincy telephone number: 01392 402024. A message can always be left there. The Blessed Sacrament Presbytery number can also be used: 01392 274724. It is now more difficult for members of the clergy to request information regarding your stay in hospital, including which Ward you are in. This is now regarded as confidential information and will not readily be supplied to any caller without the specific permission of the patient. If you are admitted to hospital and would like a member of The Chaplaincy Team to visit you —

**DO** ..... Please inform the Chaplaincy Department which ward you expect to be on and when you will be there, if you know in advance that you are going into hospital. Specifically inform a member of the ward staff that you would like to be visited by a chaplain ensuring that you state which denomination you belong to. Inform your relatives about your wishes concerning visits from a chaplain if you are taken into hospital unexpectedly. Your relatives can then notify the Chaplaincy Department

**DON'T....** Just presume that the chaplains will hear about your stay in hospital – they probably won't. DON'T expect ward staff automatically to let the chaplains know you are in hospital.

**ACT.....** If you wish to be visited by a member of The Chaplaincy Team during your stay in hospital, the Hospital Chaplaincy telephone number: 01392 402024. A message can always be left there. The Blessed Sacrament Presbytery number can also be used: 01392 274724.

**On Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> January** we will celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany in Holy Ghost Church. Traditionally on this day, in many parts of the world, gifts are exchanged. Just as the Three Kings brought gifts to Jesus, so gifts are exchanged amongst family and friends.

An ancient Christian custom associated with the Epiphany is the blessing of homes with chalk. We adopted this tradition in our parish many years ago and it is a wonderful way to quietly evangelise.

**Blessing the Home** Using chalk, mark the lintel of your front door (front porch, step or wall as follows: **20 + C + M + B + 26** 


