Your prayers and donations make all of our work possible, creating real and lasting change for your neighbours - neighbours like Shorai. This is the difference your generosity makes.

Shorai's story....
When Shorai first began farming in his community in Zimbabwe, it was difficult. The arid climate and a lack of vital equipment, like ploughs, meant doing hard, physical labour every day. Then the droughts came.

Harvests failed and his family began to go hungry. "As a father", Shorai told us, "it will be difficult for you to sleep." But Shorai and his community had an idea for a garden where the whole community could grow crops to feed their families. They reached out to CAFOD's local partners and, thanks to your donations, they were able to help.

Now, Shorai has access to an eco-garden that uses drought-resistant crops and a solar-powered water pump. That pump, funded by donations like yours, draws water from a nearby dam, turning dry ground into fertile land.

Shorai told us: "We haven't had any challenges with food since we started this project." And it's not just food security that the garden has given them: "It gives us more time as family to have quality time together, and it also increases love."
This is how, through the work of CAFOD, your love is growing to reach your neighbours. This is how, together, we are building God's kingdom.

ARE YOU GOING INTO HOSPITAL? *The Hospital Chaplaincy telephone number: 01392 402024. A message can always be left there. The Blessed Sacrament Presbytery number can also be used: 01392 274724. It is now more difficult for members of the clergy to request information regarding your stay in hospital, including which Ward you are in. This is now regarded as confidential information and will not readily be supplied to any caller without the specific permission of the patient. If you are admitted to hospital and would like a member of The Chaplaincy Team to visit you –*



DO *Please inform the Chaplaincy Department which ward you expect to be on and when you will be there, if you know in advance that you are going into hospital. Specifically inform a member of the ward staff that you would like to be visited by a chaplain ensuring that you state which denomination you belong to. Inform your relatives about your wishes concerning visits from a chaplain if you are taken into hospital unexpectedly. Your relatives can then notify the Chaplaincy Department*

DON'T.... *Just presume that the chaplains will hear about your stay in hospital – they probably won't. DON'T expect ward staff automatically to let the chaplains know you are in hospital.*

ACT..... *If you wish to be visited by a member of The Chaplaincy Team during your stay in hospital, the Hospital Chaplaincy telephone number: 01392 402024. A message can always be left there. The Blessed Sacrament Presbytery number can also be used: 01392 274724.*

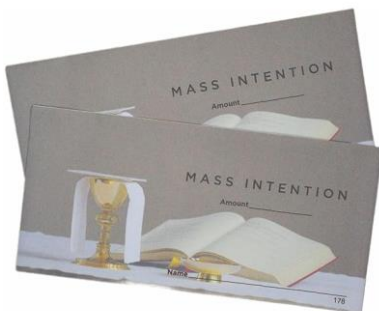

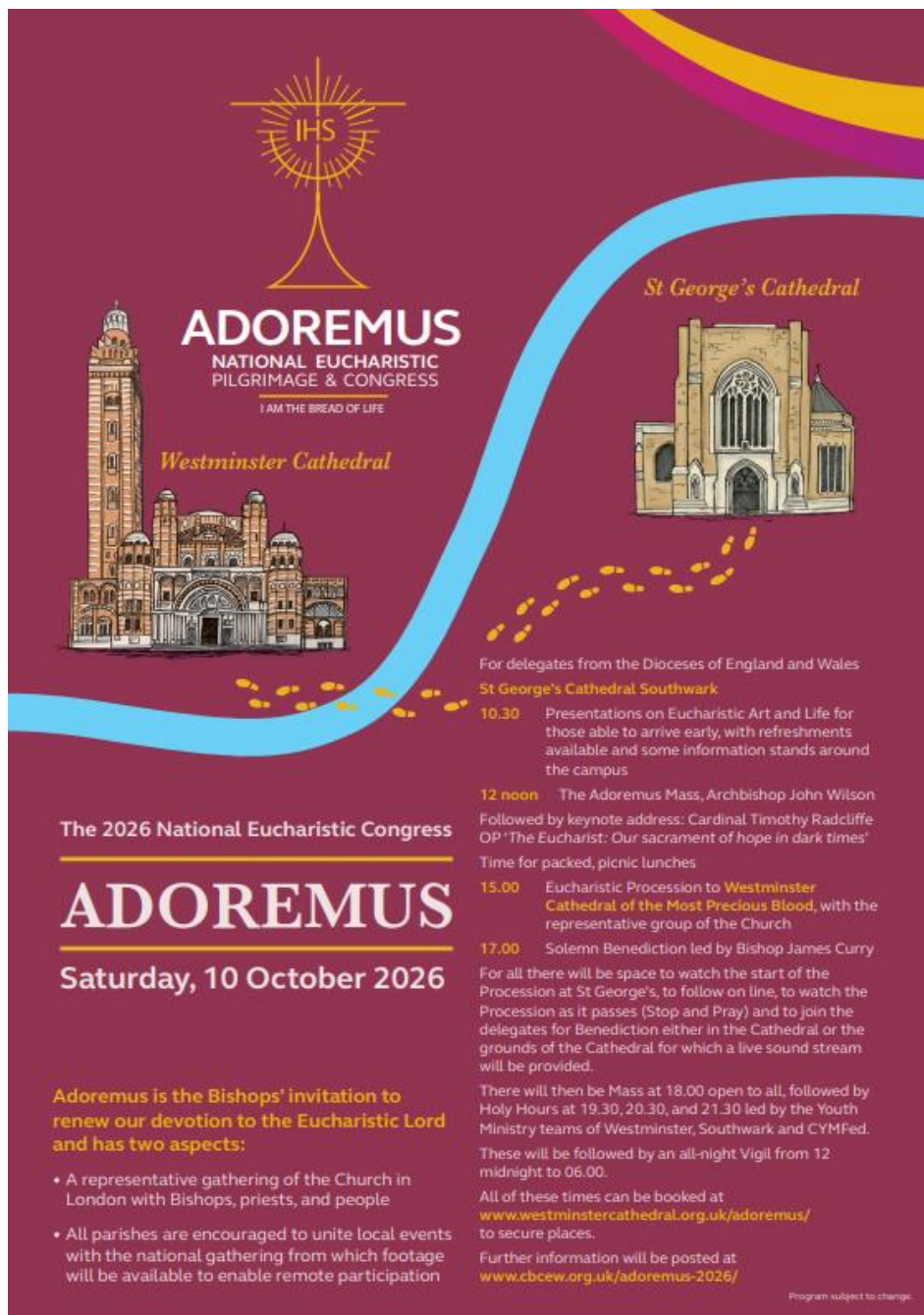

World Day of Migrants and Refugees Sunday 27th September

"Even just one of these children" The Church has been celebrating the World Day of Migrants and Refugees (WDMR) since 1914. It is always an occasion to express concern for different vulnerable people on the move, to pray for them as they face many challenges, and to increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers.



At the heart of our Diocese is Plymouth CAST, a family of 34 Catholic schools and one nursery spanning Cornwall, Devon, and Dorset. The Trust exists to ensure that our young people flourish in environments that are safe, happy, and intellectually stimulating.

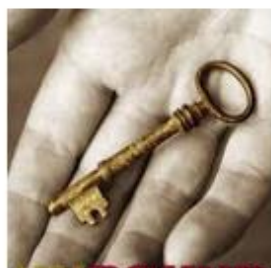

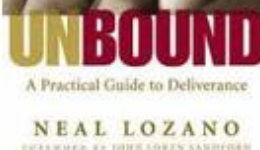

Prisoners' Week 11 to 17 October

Prisoners' Week is an opportunity to consider how we, as individuals, as a Church, and as communities, are serving our brothers and sisters affected by imprisonment.

Our prisons are in crisis. There is a record numbers of people behind bars; Inspectors regularly report instances of vermin, violence, self-harm and people languishing in cells with nothing to do. At the same time, too many people are released with no home, no job, no family and no hope.

The ripple effects of this crisis are felt well beyond the prison walls. The lives of hundreds of thousands of families and children are affected as they, too, serve a hidden sentence. Having a mother, father, husband or wife in prison can have a devastating impact, struggling to afford the basics for themselves and their children.

Lord, You offer freedom to all people.

We pray for those in prison.

Break the bonds of fear and isolation that exist.
